Denr Sir:

In presenting to you a formal petition for a charter under Theta Yau, it might be well to say a word concerning the U-Zeons and the University of Utah.

The constitution of the b-Zechs provides that membershi shall be by unmaineds vote, and is limited to sector and Junior students of the School of Mines and Empineering. The policy has been to limit the member of sective members to fitteen, but this year, on account of the number of returned senior members from former years, the present chapter numbers aventy-four.

The organisation was founded at the University of Utah in the spring of 1911, when the founders adopted the constitution of the U-Techn.



THE CONSTITUTION OF THE "U" TECHS.

ARTICLE I. Home and Object.

Section 1. This Society shall be known as the "U" Techs of the University of Utah.

Section 2. The object of this society shall be to promote interest in, and discussion of practical engineering problems.

Section 1. Students registered in the school of mines and engineering of the University of Utah, who are in full standing as juniors or senders, or graduate students and have been in residence at the University of Utah for one quarter are eligible for active membership.

Section 2. Members of the faculty of the School of Mines and Engineering of the University of Utah are eligible for honorary membership.

ARTICLE 3. Officers; duties; Elections.

Section 1. Officers shall be a Freedent, a Vice President, and a Secretary-Treasurer.

Section 2. The president shall preside at all meetings. He shall appear all committees unless otherwise specified. He shall act as chairman of the committee on membership, and shall be an ex-afficio member of all other countities.

Section 5. The Vice precident shall essist and advise the President in carrying out his dities and in the absence of the President shall preside at all motings.

Scotion h. The Secretary-Treasurer shall keep a true record of all proceedings of the body. He shall handle all correspondence of the society with first official comedity; shall keep all papers of the society under his supervision. He shall collect, receive and be responsible for all money due the society; say all bills upon morrent stands by the president, shall keep an itemized eccount of all receipts, and disbursments and shall present an annual report at the annual meeting.

Section 5. All officers for the ensuing school year shall be elected at the annual meeting of the current school year, and shall take office at the first meeting of the ensuing year.

Section 6. At the annual meeting of the committee of membermembers of the Faculty of the School of Mines and Assincering
and from among them members shall be elected. A unanisous vote
is necessary for election. Upon election they shall be notified by the
Scoretary-Treasurer that if they return to school the following year
they will become members of the society. That all memes must be
precented at the fact meeting preceding the annual meeting. That
a special election may be called by a two-thirds vote of all active
members.

Moetings. Guorum and Amendments.

Section 1. Regular meeting shall be held on the first and third Thursdays during the school year. The last meeting of the school year shall be the annual meeting. The President may call a special meeting at may time; the Secretary-Treasurer shall assist him in notifying of the special meeting.

Section 2. A majority of the active members shall constitute a quorum.

Section 3. Assessments may be levied by a two-thirds vote.

Section 4. A two-thirds vote of all active members shall be required to smend this constitution.

Section 5. Any proposed amendment to this constitution must be submitted in writing at a meeting at least two weeks before any yets can be taken upon it.

BY-LARS.

Article I.

Section 1. Dues. The annual dues of members shall be one belier and shall become delinquent at the second meeting of the school year, or the second meeting after their election.

Section 2. Initiation Dues. The initiation fee shall be Two Dollars and Fifty cents.

Section 5. Order of Business. The order of business shall be: 1- Real Call; 2- Reading of Minutes; 5- Reports of Cormittees; 1- Unfinished Business; 5- New Business; 6- Election of Officers; 7- Election of Members; 8- Entertainment; 9- Adjournment.

Article 2.

Section 1. Oaths. The new officers shall take the following oath of office: "I do hereby soleanly swear in accepting this office to fatthfully and cornectly fulfill the duties pertaining therete and to uphold the constitution and abide by the laws of this society, so help me God."
