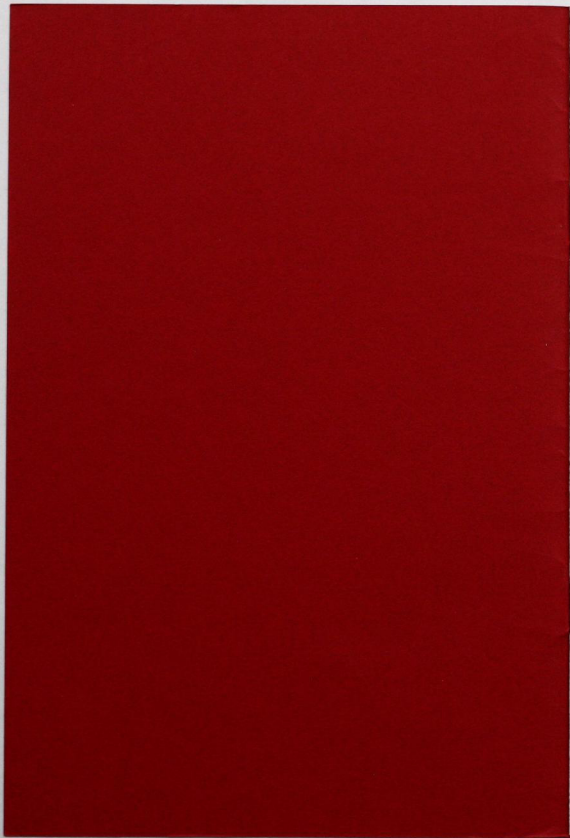
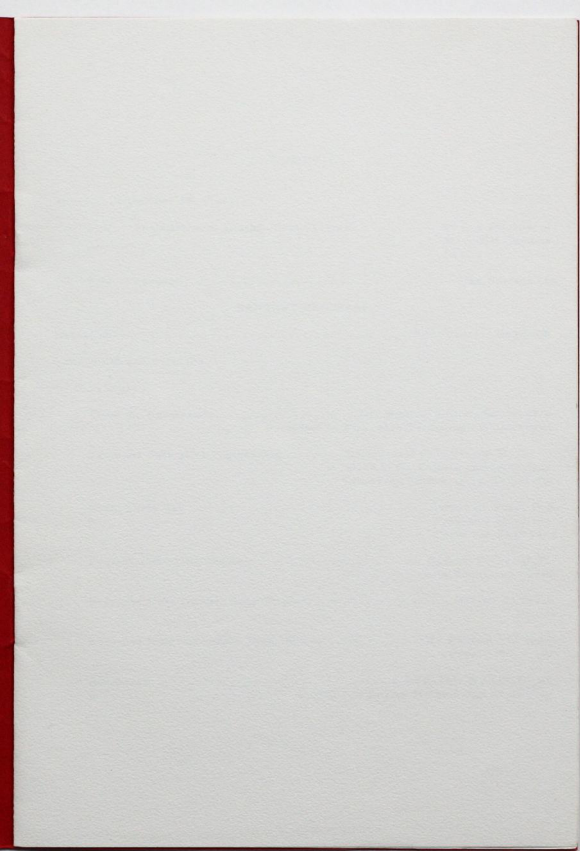


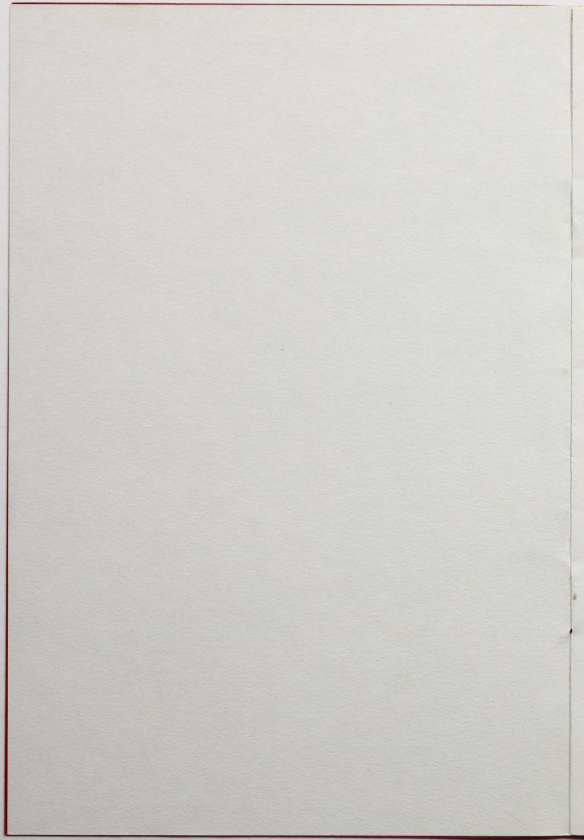

HISTORY OF THETA TAU COLONY

A considerable amount of interest in fraternities was created at Tennessee Tech in the fall of 1965. At that time the University's policy prohibited the establishment of social fraternities, although professional fraternities were permitted. Consequently, and after much lengthy discussion, a group of seven engineers -- Jim Ferguson, Carl Fritts, Terrill McGee, Wayne Tindall, Bob White, Glenn Whittaker, and Maurice Young-- decided to organize a professional engineering fraternity.

A professional fraternity was decided upon because of a desire to foster a feeling of unity among engineers and a stronger spirit of pride both in the University and in the profession of engineering. A constitution was adopted formally on February 19, 1966, and official recognition by the University was granted on May 25, 1966.

The fraternity progressed rapidly and became very active in engineering organizations. Members began taking an avid interest in their respective departmental clubs and the Engineers' Joint Council. The fraternity has furnished many officers in these clubs. Aside from activity in these departmental clubs, the fraternity has undertaken the following projects: (1) assisting in Engineers' Day, (2) giving a scholarship to the member whose quality point average shows the most improvement during the year, and (3) presenting programs to aid in the professional development of members.

The fraternity petitioned Theta Tau, national professional engineering fraternity, and received certification as a Colony October 28, 1967. As a Colony the fraternity has continued its former activities and has broadened its scope to include the following: (1) presenting a slide program concerning the profession of engineering to high school students, (2) obtaining an outstanding speaker for Engineers' Week, and (3) designing and making a Colony flag and blazer emblem.

The Colony maintains a chapter house for the use of its members. Located near the campus, the house is the hub of activity as it serves as a residence and a permanent headquarters of the Colony.
