Beta Reviews Its History at Michigan Tech Reunion

At the Michigan Tech Reunian, held Aug. 6-9, 1972 at Houghton, Mich., there were present several of the men who had been members of the Rhombehedron Club, the group which was taken into Theta Tuu as Beta Chapter — an event which gave the fraternity. These were A. F. Bensen, J. W. Young, C. A. Kumke, J. A. Barr, and H. H. Hopkins. Letters were read from several others who were unable to stend. Needles to say, many a story about the early days was brought out which large group of "old timer."

Most of the stories start with "Gabe" Bishop who entered Michigan Tech in the fall of 1903 and roomed in the Bank building downtown. After meeting several of the men, he sponsored the first of a series of parties in his room which led to the formation of the Club. The first affair probably included Bishop, Kumke, Young, Benson, Hasselbring, Robertson, Perrault, and two others. The name of Rhombehedron was chosen because the three axes and six faces of it represented the nine men present.

Some of the men had fine voices and their meetings were a great success vocally. They later leased rooms over the Drug store, rented a piano and pool table and held parties on Saturday night that were the talk of the campus. Duplicate whist was popular in those days. Pool and card tournaments were also held which wound up with the usual rarebit and beer.

During the following summer, one of the members, McCormick, took over Martin's boarding house near the

campus and invited the members to move in. Club rooms were fitted up in the basement. After one year at that location, the Club rented the Pryor House on Ruby Street.

Ike Hanks, one of our founders, spent the summer of 1904 in Houghton and became acquainted with Bob Downing, who belonged to the Club. Hanks told him about Hammer and Tongs at Minneapolis. Correspondence between the Club and that fraternity led to an invitation to join them. During the spring vacation in 1906, Downing and Andrews went to St. Paul, where they were initiated into Hammer and Tongs Fraternity. They returned to Houghton and initiated the balance of the members on March 26. 1906. Kumke was elected first regent of the new Beta Chapter.

As there was no national organization at that time, contact was maintained by Hankr of Alpha, and Earling of Beta. Later, Klepetke atted for Beta and R. W. Brown was contact man for Gamma Chapter which was established in 1900. Shrader was chairman of the inter-chapter committee and Walling was Treasurer. Arrangements were made to organize the three chapters on a national basis and Snyder and Rigby were elected delegates. The first convention was held in Minneapolis on Feb. 23-25, 1911. From then on, it is the history of Hammer and Tongs and Theta Tau Fraternity.

It was interesting to hear this group of Rhomb founders recite the activities of early days. In addition there were present several men who were active during the early period of H and T. Amoung them were Earling, first editor of the Gear, and Wiggins, Beta delegate at the second convention held in Houghton in January 1913. This group attended the meeting of Michigan Tech Reanion and also the Theat Tau dinner at the Scott Hotel on Aug, 8, at which nearly 100 Theta Taus and their wives were present. It was the largest turnout of any fraternity on the campus. At the dinner a picture of the Rhombhedron Group and one of the first group under Hammer and Tongs were presented to the Beta Regent by Brother Kumke. It was a party which will long be remembered by all.

Swinehart Made Research Director

Richard W. Swinchurz, Ben 3'1, has been named research director of the Celluloue Products Department at Dow Chemical. Dick started his career with 1931 shortly after graduating from Tech. In 1935, he was transferred to the Cellulose Department where he was engaged in phenol, lignin, and cellulous research until 1939 when he was made superintendent of Methocel. Engineering Enrollment Gain Predicted

According to reports of both the American Council on Education and the U. S. Office of Education, slightly lower college and university enrollments are predicted for this year. The latter states that a decline of 75,000 to about 2,150,000 students may be expected. However, despite this national trend for colleges and universities as a whole, schools specializing in engineering and the physical sciences may show gains up to about 20%.

Prominent Theta Tau Honored At Retirement

Large scale gold dredging operations, responsible for suttiming the economy of Fairbanks and interior Alaks for many years and today an important factor in the stable economy of the guidance of Roy B. Earling, Beta '08. Hereitien il Junea s vice president and general manager of Alaskan operations for the United States Smeling, Refining and Mining company, after an association of more than 10 vers.

Brother Earling was honored with a farewell dinner which was attended by close to 60 company employees and friends. Tributes to his outstanding success in the field of mining and as a friend of the Fairbanks community were paid by several speakers.

Earling, a graduate of the Michigan College of Mines, was with various copper mining companies in Montana and Arizona before beginning his long association with the United States Smelting, Refining and Mining Company. From 1910 until 1925 he was assistant construction engineer at the company's Boston, Mass. headquarters. This was followed by two years at Nome where he served as assistant manager of the Hammon Consolidated Gold Fields, a subsidiary of U.S.S.R. and M. Co. There he developed methods and equipment for large scale application of newly discovered "Cold Water Thawing Methods" for thawing frozen placer gravels.

In 1927 Brother Earling was transferred to Fairbanks where the company's power plant and the first of the dredges were under construction. Under his able guidance through the years that followed, the techniques essential to the success of large scale gold dredging operations were carried out. The company is considered one of the most outstanding and the largest in the territory.

From 1927 until 1948, Earling was consulting engineer, manager, vice president and general manager of Fairbanks operations; in 1942 he became a director of the U.S.S.R. and M. Company. From 1948 until his retirement he was vice president and general manager of Alaskan operations.



During those years he developed application of the hydraulic stripping method to large scale muck removal and helped develop a mechanical point driving machine now used at Fairbanks.

With their three daughters now away from home, the Earling have settled on Bainbridge Island near Seattle in a home they owned for many years.

Three Members of Theta Tau Horored by Alma Mater

Among six prominent alumni of the Colorado School of Mines to be awarded Distinguished Achievement Medals at the May, 1952 Commencement were three members of Gamma chapter of Theta Tau. The following citations were read:

"Rupert B. Lowe, Engineer of Mines, Class of 1922. New York, New York. Born in Weatherford, Texas, at the turn of the century, he worked for United Comstock Mines Company and the Texas Bridge Company before joining Bakelite in 1923. He is vice-president of three Bakelite branches - Division of Union Carbide and Carbon Corporation, Bakelite Company, Canada, Ltd., and Bakelite de Mexico. He is also director of Heller Brothers Company of New Jersev and Ohio."

"John R. Evans, Engineer of Mines,

Class of 1923. Fort Worth, Texas. A U.S. Marine Corps veteran of World War I, he was a core drill superintendent and petroleum engineer for oil companies before joining Stanolind in 1931. Presently a director of the Stanolind Oil and Cas Co. and division manager of the North Texas-New Mexico Division of Stanolind, he contributed much to the field of petroleum exploration, development and recovery."

"Armor B. Martin, Engineer of Mines, Class of 1923, Butte, Montana. Well known for his ability and versatility, he is chief engineer of the Montana Power Company, the organization he joined as gas engineer in 1991. I was very glad to hear from you and, through you, of Dr. Louderback.

I have, little by little, become separated from the University and from a great number of friends there, including the brothers in Theta Tau. I am therefore, very happy to be able to renew these acquaintances.

Since leaving Metals Reserve at the end of the war, I returned to Latin America via Brazil, British Guiana, and Mexico, finding myself in Honduras about six years ago. Here I acquired a timber tract and installed a saw mil — quite a departure from mining.

Three are in Hondura's induced growths of excellent Long Leaf Yellow Pine, which, if properly manufactured, make lumber suitable for export to the U.S. and Europe. By installing anti-statis in textment and carefully supervised grading. I have been able to develop a satisfactory export market. NATIONAL DUES

One of the important matter demanding serious consideration and probable legislative action at the Convention this year will be a progoal to increase the National Fest and Dase. The ever upward spiral of prices has already forced us to serious financial compromises which should be corrected in the immediate future. The economise which have been practiced and which will continue to be practiced have accomplished about all that can be expected. The increasing force of inflation can only be met, it appears, by increasing our income.

That we are far from being alone in this predicament is obvious as is evidenced in the following excerpt from the September 12, 1952 issue of the Interfraternity Research and Advisory Council:

"Reports of conventions of various fraternities, held this past summer, almost uniformly indicate that delegates have approved increases in initiation fees and other charges in order to provide for the mounting costs of maintaining services to chapters and members.

"Two surveys of initiation fees, dues and other charges, conducted through the College Fraternity Secretaries Association, have provided helpful, comparative data for grand officers, delegates, and others concerned with the problem. From these, it appears that the average undergraduate has been paying only about \$1.50 per month for his affiliation with a national or international society, and this frequently has fulfilled his obligations for life membership. In a few organizations, the per member cost during four undergraduate years now exceeds \$100; in these, delegates have usually mandated frequent conventions and regional conclaves, with delegate expenses paid, and other exceptional or unusual budgetary requirements."
