ΘΤ RUBE GOLDBERG CONTEST

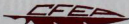

The joint effort of Theta Tau and Phi Sigma Rho won the 2003 national contest and were guests on *The Late Show with David Letterman*. This contest continues to generate favorable publicity for Theta Tau.

FRATERNITY AFFINITY PROGRAMS

Over the years, the Fraternity has formed a handful of relationships with vendors to offer products that we think would be of interest and benefit to our members and which provide some income to Theta Tau. That literally is just a handful of the dozens of proposals that we receive annually. Those with which we enter into contract are required to keep our member's mailing information confidential, not to provide it to any other entities, nor to use it for any other purpose. Though income to the national Fraternity is minimal, it is through these few agreements that we have been able to keep all student fees unchanged for the last decade. Over that same decade, financial pressure has been placed upon our student members resulting from public university tuition increases averaging 38 - 47% depending on the measure used. We very much appreciate your participation with these partners, your tolerating a few mail pieces so that others may have the opportunity to do business with them, and your enabling us to keep membership affordable for the greatest potential number of students.

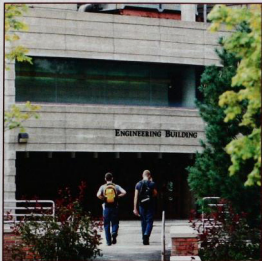

It offers quiet spaces for reflection which provide the perfect setting for the goals the Leadership Academy Curricula seeks to accomplish.

Led by **Mike Livingston** and **Chris Stockman** as main facilitators, the success of the Academy's leadership training curricula has solidified it as an invaluable tool in preparing our students for life and career. Fortunately, the financial support of many, many alumni will enable the Foundation to continue this program. Bringing members together in a secluded area, housed together, sharing meals together, learning together and having fun together in an educational environment has proven its worth. The main curricula began Friday morning and continued well into the evening.



The curricula helped students identify their own leadership characteristics and areas where they may need to develop further as leaders. Portions of the day were spent in large group session, others in smaller discussion groups, and some time spent one-on-one with a learning partner. This educational curricula continued into Saturday morning with the leadership development model popularized by Kouzes-Posner's *The Leadership Challenge* and updated to include components based on Spencer Johnson's *Who Moved My Cheese*.

The grand-prize winning posters will be reproduced and mailed to all schools of participating students and will be displayed in GEICO offices nationwide.

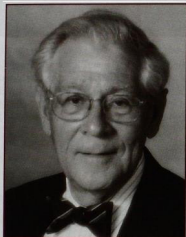

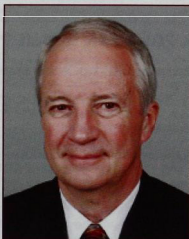
LAUREATES INDUCTED



Marcus Crotts, Rho '53 has been honored for outstanding service to his profession. Brother Crotts received his Bachelor of Science in Mechanical Engineering from North Carolina State University in 1953 and Master of Science in Mechanical Engineering from University of Illinois in 1956. He is Chairman of Crotts and Saunders Engineering, Inc. Marcus Crotts is an exemplary model of service to profession. He has served as National President, Regional and Local Chair of Society of Manufacturing Engineering, where he continues his service on their Board of Directors. He has also served as president of the American Machine Tool Distributors Association and North Carolina Society of Engineers. He has been recognized as a "Distinguished Engineer" by both North Carolina State University and University of Illinois and named "Engineer of the Year" by the NC Society of Engineers. He also served as a trustee of NC State University and received a Meritorious Service Award from them. He received the Joseph A. Siegel Award for outstanding service from SME. Brother Crotts is an active Rotarian and also serves on the Board of Directors for multiple businesses, civic

organizations, and educational institutions. Brother Crotts is a role model of service to our profession.

James E. Drewry, Pi '60 has been honored for outstanding service to his profession. Brother Drewry received his BS in Aeronautical Engineering in 1960, and a MS in Engineering Physics in 1962 from University of Virginia. He earned a



PhD in Aerospace Engineering from the University of Toronto in 1967. Dr. Drewry exemplifies our profession in putting scientific knowledge to practical uses. At the US Dept of Air Force, he received awards for his work with supersonic combustion ramjet engines for hypersonic flight and high energy gasdynamic lasers for airborne and space systems. At the Gas Research Institute, he was directly involved in moving twenty new technologies to successful commercialization. At Teledyne, he had total operational responsibility for the R & D facility that developed the engines for Harpoon and Tomahawk cruise missiles. In 1990, he became the Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer of Oak Ridge

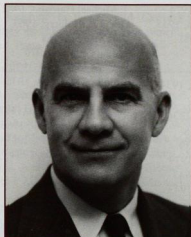
Associated Universities, a consortium of 85 colleges and universities. Since that time, ORAU more than doubled in research, services and revenues; a further testimony of making practical application of science and technology.

John W. Harrelson, Rho '09 is a charter member of Rho chapter. He has been honored for service to his profession and service to Theta Tau Fraternity. Brother Harrelson received his BA in engineering in 1909 and MA in Mechanical Engineering in 1915 from North Carolina State University. He served on the faculty of NC State University from 1909 to 1953, serving as Chancellor the last 20 years of his tenure. Harrelson Hall, so named in his honor, is the first cylindrical classroom structure ever built on a universi-



ty campus. He did interrupt his career at NC State University on three occasions: In 1929-1933 to Head the State of North Carolina Department of Conservation and Development during the Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) days; and to military service in the U.S. Army as a Colonel in WW I and as Deputy Chief of Specialized Training in WW II. Brother Harrelson

was a long time advocate for Theta Tau on and off the NC State campus. Brother Harrelson passed in 1955 and is honored posthumously.



A. Dexter Hinckley, Theta, '27 has been honored posthumously for outstanding service to Theta Tau and the engineering profession. Brother Hinckley received his BA and EE degrees from Columbia University in 1925 and 1927, respectively. He served on the Engineering faculty from 1927 to 1944 at Santa Clara, Mechanics Institute of New York, and Columbia University, culminating as Assistant to the Dean during his last 10 years at Columbia. He also was a Senior Consultant in Engineering Education to the US Department of Education. He was the Executive Director of the Illuminating Engineering Society from 1944 through 1967. Brother Hinckley was the Advisor for Theta Chapter for 22 years. He also went on to serve the National Fraternity, serving on the Executive Council from 1941-1958, with the last four years as Grand Regent. Significant effort was needed during this time to maintain or rejuvenate the chapters that had ceased to exist during WW II. The 60th Anniversary Convention was named the A. Dexter Hinckley Convention in his honor. Dex was faithful in writing to each Convention until his death in 1993.

The Theta Tau Alumni Hall of Fame was established in 1986 to recognize those who have made significant contributions to Theta Tau and/or to their chosen professions. The suggestion of yourself or of others who should be considered for this honor should be directed to the Theta Tau Central Office. Names and information will be referred to a chapter or the Executive Council for possible nomination. From among those nominated, Laureates are selected by the Alumni Hall of Fame Judging Committee.

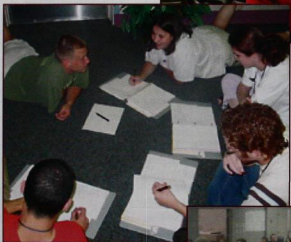

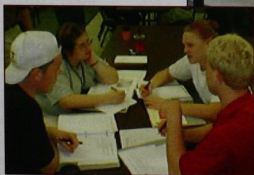

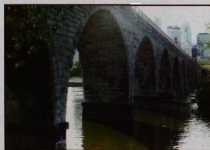
