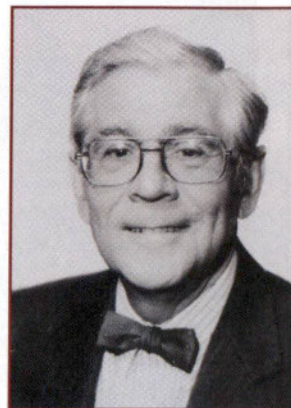

Marcus B. Crotts, Rho '53, was elected President of the Society of Manufacturing Engineers for the year. Currently he serves on the SME board of directors and also on the board of directors of the SME Education Foundation. In 1986 he was recognized with the SME Joseph A. Siegel Award and in 1987 was elected to the SME College of Fellows. He is a life member of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers and served as ASME Vice President. Brother Crotts is a mechanical engineering graduate of North Carolina State University and received his masters degree in mechanical engineering from the University of Illinois. He has served on the NCSU Board of Trustees, as president of the NCSU Alumni Association, and as a director of the Engineering Foundation. He was named Distinguished Engineering Alumnus by NCSU in 1981 and also received the university's Meritorious Service Award. The University of Illinois honored him with its Distinguished Engineering Award in 1980. He is a member of Tau Beta Pi and Phi Kappa Phi. He is a Certified Manufacturing Engineer and a Professional Engineer and has served as president of the North Carolina Society of Engineers. Brother Crotts, of Winston-Salem, North Carolina, is Chairman of Crotts and Saunders Engineering.



Joe H. Engle, Zeta '56, was enshrined in the National Aviation Hall of Fame in Dayton, Ohio, on Saturday, July 21, 2001, for his individual achievements and lifelong contributions to flight. Born in Abilene, Kansas, Major General Engle earned an aeronautical engineering degree from the University of Kansas prior to receiving his Air Force wings in 1958. He attended test pilot school at Edwards AFB, became an X-a5 pilot, and was America's youngest astronaut. Astronaut Engle served in a variety of backup roles with the Apollo program, flew initial shuttle tests, and commanded two shuttle flights, in 1981 and 1985. His 14,000 flight hours include 224 hours in space. He continues to serve NASA today as a consultant to the international space station program. Brother Engle was initiated by Zeta Chapter while an undergraduate student at KU and was inducted into the Theta Tau Alumni Hall of Fame in 1997. Other well known enshrinees of the National Aviation Hall of Fame are legends of flight such as the Wright Brothers, Jimmy Doolittle, Amelia Earhart, Chuck Yeager, and John Glenn.



TWO COLONIES CERTIFIED



Late last school year and early this school year, Theta Tau certified colonies at northern reaches of the nation. An informal meeting was held prior to each official ceremony so that the new colony members would have an opportunity to become better acquainted with members of Theta Tau. Grand Regent **Glen A. Wilcox** presided at certification ceremonies at the State University of New York at Binghamton and at Montana Tech at the University of Montana (formerly Montana College of Mineral Science & Technology). These colonies established in the last year are on their way to increasing membership, improving visibility and involvement on campus and within their respective engineering schools, and beginning work on chapter petitions. The Fraternity welcomes these new colonies and looks forward to the day each becomes a chapter in Theta Tau.

On December 7, 2001, four representatives of Theta Tau flew into Butte for the certification at Montana Tech of the University of Montana. Following the ceremony, a banquet was held. Representing Montana Tech

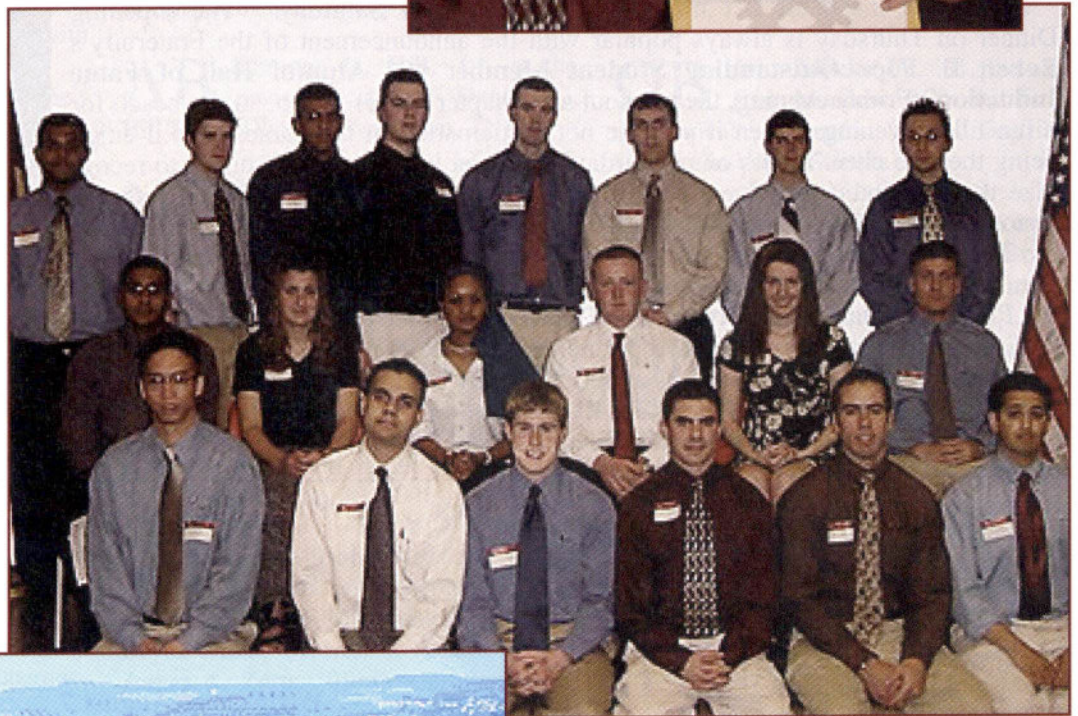
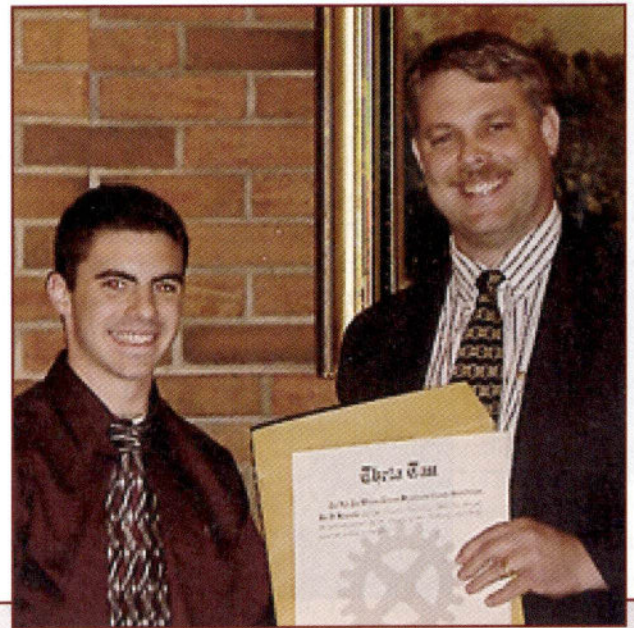

2002 CONVENTION IN FLORIDA

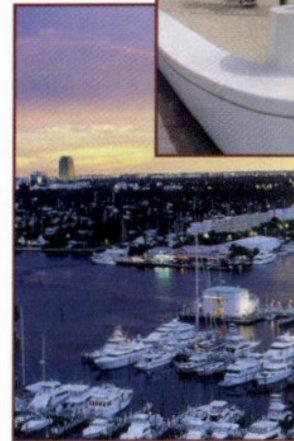
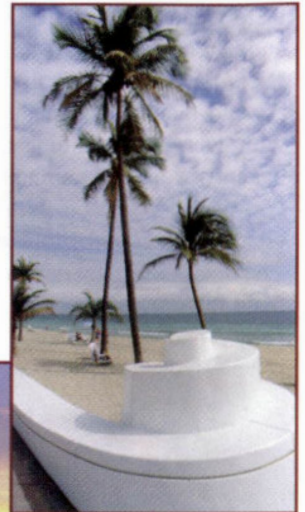

The Theta Tau Educational Foundation's Second Leadership Academy was August 9-12 at The Ohio State University. The success of this second Academy's leadership training curricula has solidified it as an invaluable tool in preparing our students for life and career. Fortunately, the financial support of many, many alumni will enable the foundation to continue this program. Bringing members together in a secluded area, housed together, sharing meals together, learning together and having fun

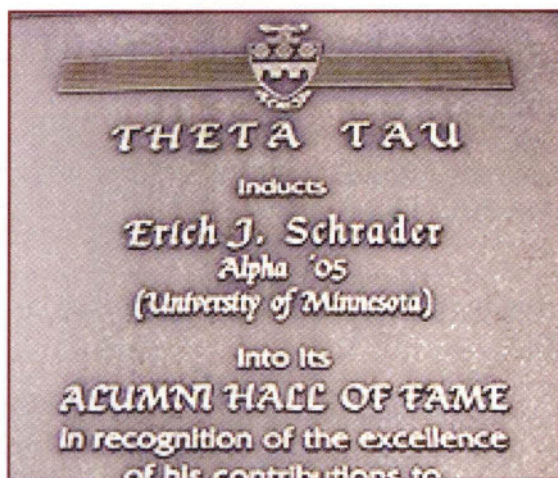

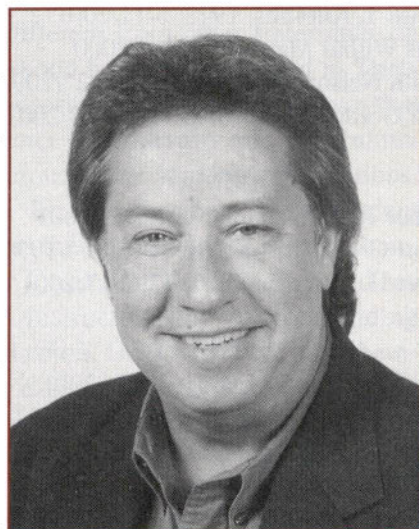


MS in Computer Engineering in 1983 from Syracuse University. Dean served his chapter as Regent and numerous other offices. He served on the Executive Council from 1986 to 1998 serving as Grand Marshal, Grand Scribe, Grand Vice-Regent, and Grand Regent. He was selected Outstanding Delegate

at the 1981 Theta Tau National Conference. During Dean's six-year tenure as Grand Regent, nine chapters were installed, six colonies were certified, and the Theta Tau Outstanding Student Member Program was inaugurated. Dean has served as Tau Chapter Adviser, President of the Tau Chapter House Corporation, officer of the Syracuse University Alumni InterFraternity Council, and a founder of the Central New York Alumni Club. He is a member of Eta Kappa Nu, Tau Beta Pi, IEEE, UniForum, and founder and Director of UniForum Central New York. Dean resides in Fayetteville, NY, and is a Senior Systems Engineer with CABLExpress Corporation.

Robert A. Bibb, Zeta '70, has been honored for outstanding contributions to his profession and service to the Fraternity. Brother Bibb received his BS in Aerospace from the University of Kansas in 1970. He attends all of the planned alumni events at Zeta Chapter and is selfless in his donations of time, resources, and money to the chapter and the Zeta House Corporation. Bob is the founder and an officer of Bibb and Associates, a 260-person energy-consulting firm that regularly is ranked among the leading engineering

firms in Kansas City. Brother Bibb is a member of ASME, NSPE, KES, the Society of American Military Engineers, the American Public Power Association, the Electric Power Supply Association, and the Council of Industrial Boiler Owners. Among his civic activities he lists membership in the Chamber of



Commerce of Greater Kansas City, of Overland Park, and of Merriam. He is also a member of the Kansas City Development Association, the Nelson-Atkins Gallery Business Council, the Rotary Club, the Miega High School Foundation Board, and the GOP Club of Johnson County.

Gerald J. Dittberner, Alpha '64, has been honored for outstanding contributions to his profession. A 1964 graduate of the University of Minnesota with the BEE degree, he also earned his MS in Meteorology and Space Science and Engineering in 1969 and his PhD in Meteorology in 1977 from the University of Wisconsin. Brother Dittberner served in the US Air Force from 1964-85 ending his air Force



career as a Lieutenant Colonel and Program Manager in the Office of Scientific Research at Boling AFB with responsibility for basic research and research policy in atmospheric sciences. Most recently, he is the Geostationary Operational Environmental Satellite Program Manager responsible for planning, system development, satellite operations, budget formulation, and program direction. He is a member of the American Meteorological Society, the National Weather Association, the American Geophysical Society, and the Wisconsin Academy of Arts, Sciences, and Letters. He has been the recipient of several NASA Group Achievement Awards, received the American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics Distinguished Service Award, the USAF Meritorious Service Medal, became a fellow in the Royal Meteorological Society in 1984 and an Associate Fellow of AIAA in 1991.

Ralph R. Teetor, Phi Hon. '12, has been honored posthumously for outstanding contributions to his profession. Brother Teetor received his BSME from University of Pennsylvania in 1912 and his ME from Penn in 1930. He received honorary degrees from Earlham College and the Indiana Institute of Technology. He was a life member of the Society of Automotive Engineers and served as its president in 1936. He also served on the SAE Research and Technical Committees, Technical Board, and served as chair of the Meetings Committee. He was a member of ASME, Engineering Society of New York, University of Chicago Club, Detroit Athletic Club, Indianapolis Athletic Club, Columbia Club in Indianapolis, the Indiana Society of Chicago, and the Newcomen Society. Brother Teetor established the SAE Ralph R. Teetor Educational Fund and designated that the money was to be used to further SAE's educa-

tional program. Early in his career he worked for a family motor company and then for NY Shipbuilding Corporation. He spent much of his professional career with The Perfect Circle Company (known for its piston manufacturing) including eleven years as its President from 1946-57. He is most noted for his invention of cruise control in 1958. Common on today's automobiles, it was first introduced on Chrysler's Imperial, New Yorker, and Windsor models.

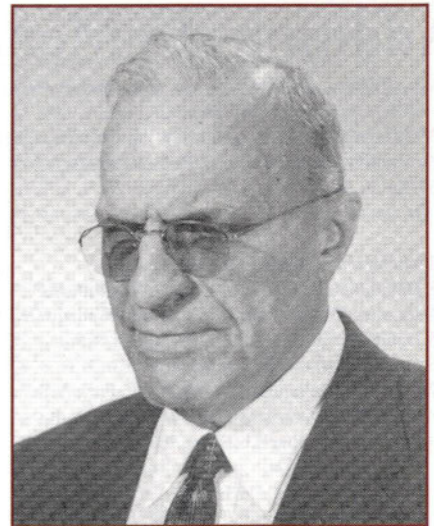
