History of TCNJ

The College of New Jersey, often referred to by its acronym TCNJ, is a New Jersey state institution. It has gone through many names and changes over the past 165 years of operation. It opened in 1855 as the New Jersey State Normal School. At this point, it was the first teacher training school in the state of New Jersey. Since then, it has had 5 other names: The New Jersey State Normal School at Trenton, New Jersey State Teachers College and State Normal School at Trenton, New Jersey State Teachers College at Trenton, and Trenton State College. Its current name, "The College of New Jersey", was previously used by what is now known as Princeton University. The College of New Jersey was located in the city of Trenton for 73 years, and moved locations to Ewing, NJ in 1928. The first structure to be built on Ewing grounds was Green Hall, which has influenced the architecture of the entire campus. By 1972, the school had expanded their major selection to include paths of study outside of education.

Rank

The College of New Jersey has always been a highly competitive institution, this fact even more solidified in the 1970s. For the past 10 years, the college's acceptance rate has been significantly less than the national average of 55% and now stands at 49%. It is currently ranked as one of the 75 "Most Competitive" institutions by Barron's Profiles of American Colleges. In the "Northern Regional Universities" category of the U.S. News & World Reports, the college is ranked #4. TCNJ has a 95% freshman retention rate and an 85% graduation rate.

Community

TCNJ is home to over 6,000 diverse students, with over 50 degree options. The schools at TCNJ include Arts & Communication, Business, Humanities & Social Sciences, Education, Engineering, Nursing/Health & Exercise Science, and Science. The College of New Jersey strives itself on diversity and leadership development. There are more than 300 on campus student organizations, which range from social clubs, to Greek life, to professional societies, and everything in between. There is something for every student at this institution, shaping leaders across all professional industries.



History of TCNJ School of Engineering

Engineering was introduced in the School of Technology at Trenton State College in 1971 under the leadership of Dr. Robert Thrower, Dean of Technology. Approximately thirty students graduated from this program in 1976. Programs in Electronics, Industrial Engineering Technology, and Mechanical Engineering Technology were introduced in the late 1970's. All Engineering Technology programs were then terminated under the leadership of Dr. Robert Bittner, and the Bachelor of Science program in Engineering Science was introduced in 1993. The School of Technology was renamed to the School of Engineering in 1996.

In the early 2000's, Dr. George Facas created Bachelor of Science (BS) programs in Computer Engineering, Electrical Engineering, Civil Engineering, Biomedical Engineering and Mechanical Engineering. All of these BS programs have been accredited by the Engineering Accreditation Commission of ABET since 2007.

The School of Engineering is now one of the seven academic schools at The College of New Jersey. Within the School of Engineering exists six engineering disciplines, as well as Management and STEM Education programs. Before a designated STEM building was built in the Fall of 2017, there were two buildings that hosted engineering courses: Armstrong Hall and Forcina Hall. Since the modernized STEM building opened up to students, most discipline-specific classes are taught in either Armstrong Hall or the STEM building.

History of TCNJ Colony of Theta Tau

Bringing Theta Tau to the TCNJ campus began with our now well-known alumni, Hussain Khajanchi, who at the time was a sophomore Electrical Engineering student. As the only engineering student in his social fraternity, Hussain was looking to join an organization that would help him develop professional skills to become a successful engineer. He consulted one of his peers at New Jersey Institute of Technology (NJIT) about the benefits of Alpha Kappa Psi, a professional business fraternity, when he realized that something tailored for engineers would be much more beneficial both for him and the engineering community at large at TCNJ. There were plenty of organizations at TCNJ that offered these services for students in business, music, etc., but no organizations that offered these same benefits for engineering students. After discovering Theta Tau, Hussain believed that this organization would be a substantial asset to the engineering community at TCNJ. He believed Theta Tau would offer a platform for social and academic development tailored for engineering students. Hussain, along with 4 other members, started the first executive board, gaining immediate interest from over 100 engineering students.

The first step the executive board took in becoming a recognized organization on campus was through student government. After presenting the ideas and values of this organization to student government officials, the interest group for Theta Tau was quickly approved as a recognized student organization in the Spring of 2019. After this, the executive board sent out applications for chair positions, whereby 6 chairs were elected. The 11 board members began operating in true Theta Tau manner and recruited 17 more dedicated members through an interview process among a group of 40 interested engineering students at TCNJ. This brought the organization to 28 members, all of which are the first class of our colony.

In order to proceed with the Theta Tau colonization process, the executive board opened a line of communication with Zack Johnson, Theta Tau's Director of Expansion at the time. The executive board coordinated with Zack to schedule a visit from a Theta Tau National officer to TCNJ's campus for April 12th, 2019. Zack, along with executive board members, toured TCNJ's engineering buildings and met TCNJ's Head of Fraternity/Sorority Expansion, Dave Conner, and the representative for the Dean of Engineering, Dr. Martha Stella (Assistant Dean of Engineering). Zack also gave a presentation to the founding class of this Theta Tau interest group about the benefits of Theta Tau colonization and the process/timeline for the coming months.

Our organization was able to show immense dedication to service, brotherhood, and professionalism, whereby we were able to submit a petition to become an official colony of Theta Tau. Our petition was approved, and thus the planning for a colonization ceremony began.

On September 21st, 2019, our organization planned for the National Officers to come and perform our colonization ceremony. The ceremony was held at TCNJ and was followed with a banquet, where the National Board Members were able to sit and eat with the newly colonized members. There was an incredible sense of brotherhood in the atmosphere as questions were asked to the National Board Members, where they shared their wisdom. The colonization ceremony finished with a unique tradition that will follow through our organization for years to come. This newly adapted tradition included the past Regent, Hussain Khajanchi, and the Regent



at the time, Conor Collins, cutting a celebratory cake together. Although this cake was for the colonization celebration, it will be implemented into every new executive board change to celebrate the past executive board's accomplishments, and to wish the best to the incoming executive board.

Since being colonized, we have had 4 semesters of recruitment, totaling to 77 active members. An immeasurable amount of support for each other, compassion for this organization, and dedication for the development of this organization has been seen since our interest group was formed, and it continues to grow every day. It is truly inspiring to see the growth and development of this colony as it becomes more established.
